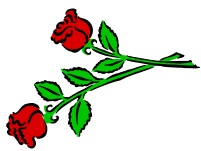

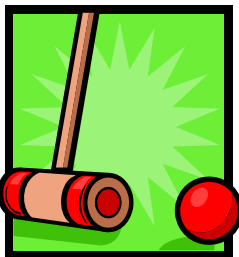
Come for one or for all as best works with your summer schedule. We will begin at 7 and end with Compline at 8PM. You will be home before dark!

### **YOUTH MISSION TRIP**

**Week of Sunday, July 13, 2014**

**Youth from Trinity, Allendale & St. John's, Ramsey to join us!**

Following a highly successful and fun Youth Mission Trip in 2013 we have booked a reservation at Cross Roads for the week of July 13<sup>th</sup>. To be determined by the youth participating will be whether we go Sunday to Friday or Sunday to Saturday. Also to be determined is if we will stay in the same lodge we did last year OR if we want to spend a little more and stay in the hotel-like Christ Center with twin beds and private baths for each room or 2 to 3 people.

We will again utilize the camp for meals and facility uses (pool, ropes course, archery) because that was such a great option last year. The group from last year (Julia Miles, Julia Hansen, Olivia Nazare, Bryce Dugan and Christian Nazare) especially indicated wanting to go back to Haven of Hope, the program that offers week long vacation to families of children with a life limiting illness. Our two days with this program last year was a highlight for us. How we will spend our volunteer work days will be determined by the group who sign up to participate.

If you didn't join us last year we hope you will consider joining us this year. If you did come last year we hope you will come again!



Youth who have finished at least 7<sup>th</sup> grade are eligible to participate. We also need adult chaperones to attend. We do not know how the new Youth Minister will fit into this program but certainly hope he / she will be able to participate along with youth from the other parishes. We had to make the reservation to hold the spot. We will be able to take up to 18 youth and 4 chaperones. Will you be one of them.

## **St. Alban's Goes to Cross Roads Camp**

**‘THRICE’ this summer!**

**We are nearing 20 people in total!!!**

There are three weeks when the numbers at Cross Roads Camp, our diocesan church camp, will swell with members of St. Alban's. If you have a child or grandchild who has finished at least the second grade then I encourage you to consider giving them a week at this great camp or giving your whole family a treat at Family Camp! The Youth and Family Institute reports that 80% of those who practice the faith as adults point to a church camp experience in their youth as a significant contributing factor. Time at Cross Roads will be a gift that truly contributes to shaping our life-story.

### **THREE OPPORTUNITIES:**

**The Week of July 13<sup>th</sup> the Tri-Parish Mission Trip** will be in residence at Cross Roads. While they will not be involved in the daily activities of the camp they will eat their meals with the rest of the camp and join in some pool time and evening programs. If you have a first time camper this would be a nice way to have a first experience where they will see familiar faces at meals.

**Family Camp Weekend** is being held July 25<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> and the Philhower family (Allison, Caeley and Liam) will be in attendance. Caeley has attended Cross Roads for years\* and this year will share the experience with her family. At Family Camp each family has a cabin or conference room and participate with the other family campers for meals, activities and worship. This is a GREAT way to introduce younger or reluctant participants of all ages to the joy of church camping. I WOULD LOVE TO SEE US HAVE 5 – FAMILY UNITS GO ... YOU DON'T HAVE TO HAVE KIDS TO ENJOY FAMILY CAMP!!!

**Mission:** To engage in service projects 2-3 hours per day that may include interior painting, simple gardening / yard work, work at a food pantry, and other projects still in progress.

**Accommodations:** We will stay in the rectory of Epiphany Church, Ventnor. It is a simply furnished, slightly dated, yet awesome house one-block from the beach! It has five bedrooms, one and a half baths, large living room, dining room, kitchen, and enclosed sun porch (also suitable for sleeping). The house is on the church property and shares a common fenced courtyard. So it will be ‘Simple, communal, and adequate’ lodging!

**Food:** We will be responsible for our own meals that we will prepare and serve family style.

**Schedule:** Flexible! We want to make it work for anyone who is interested. Some may come for the whole week and some may come for a few days. Sign-up in the narthex and reserve your sleeping space!

**Cost:** Cost will be for food (simple, healthy and easy!) and we are asking \$5 per night per person per night with a \$20 maximum per family). This will be used for the cost of materials.
